**ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OF FRENCH (TENURE TRACK)
Beginning August 2019**

The Department of Romance Languages at St. Olaf College invites applications for a full-time, tenure-track position in French at the Assistant Professor level to begin in August 2019. We are looking for candidates who demonstrate a commitment to undergraduate liberal arts education. The specialization is open, but particular interest in and demonstrated experience with second language acquisition (SLA) enhanced by innovative uses of new technologies is required. Interdisciplinary approaches such as critical race studies, gender studies and/or cultural studies and interest in undergraduate research are a strong plus.

St. Olaf's Romance Languages Department is particularly interested in applicants who will continue to contribute to our diverse community and broaden our curricular offerings. We request that in the letter of application, candidates address their potential to contribute to the St. Olaf community that maintains a diversity of people and perspectives as one of its core values. We strongly encourage applications from members of underrepresented minority groups.

The normal teaching load is six courses per year. Regular teaching responsibilities include all levels of French language and major-level courses in the literatures and cultures of the French-speaking world. There are also opportunities to teach interdisciplinary courses such as race studies, area studies (Africa and the Americas, Middle Eastern Studies, etc.), and women and gender studies, and in our Foreign Languages Across the Curriculum (FLAC) program. A successful candidate will be expected to develop and lead study abroad programs during the January term abroad. Required qualifications: Applicants are expected to have completed a Ph.D. in French by September 1, 2019, but ABD candidates will be considered; native or near-native fluency in French; potential for excellence in teaching at the undergraduate level.
